Egypt: Dynasty 18 to Dynasty 21 (c. 1560 BCE-945 BCE)

Question 3 (25 marks)

Outline the military activities of Ramses I and Seti I and evaluate their contribution to the re-establishment of the Egyptian Empire.

or

Question 4 (25 marks)

Describe the diplomatic activities of Ramses II and evaluate his success.

or

Question 5 (25 marks)

Outline the funerary beliefs and burial practices in Dynasties 18–20 and explain any changes to them that occurred during this period.

Greece: Athenian democracy and Empire from the creation of the Delian League to the revolt of Samos in 440/39 BCE

Question 6 (25 marks)

Outline Cimon's domestic and foreign policies. Evaluate the impact of these policies on Athens' political development and her relationship with Sparta.

or

Question 7 (25 marks)

Outline how the Athenians lost their land empire. Assess the effect of this loss on Athenian foreign policy up to the revolt of Samos in 440/39 BCE.

or

Question 8 (25 marks)

Outline and evaluate Thucydides' explanation of the growth of Athenian power up to the revolt of Samos in 440/39 BCE.

Rome: Augustus from the first settlement of Augustus in 27 BCE to his death in 14 CE

Question 9 (25 marks)

Outline and assess changes in Augustus' political position in Rome during the period of study.

or

Question 10 (25 marks)

Assess the extent to which the Augustan *Leges Juliae* were social and cultural changes. Focus on at least **one** Augustan law in your answer.

or

Question 11 (25 marks)

Outline the social and political changes that led to the rise of the equestrian order and assess different responses to this rise during the period of study.

Unit 3B - People, ideas and events that shaped history

You are required to answer **one** (1) of the following questions. You must answer your chosen question with reference to **one** (1) of the following contexts only.

Egypt: The Amarna 'Revolution' from the rise of the Cult of the Aten during the

18th Dynasty to the death of Horemheb (c. 1295 BCE)

or

Greece: The Peloponnesian War from 440/39 BCE to the surrender of Athens in 404/03 BCE

or

Rome: The Julio-Claudians from the death of Augustus in 14 CE to the death of Nero

in 68 CE

Question 12 (25 marks)

Discuss the extent to which **one** of the following individuals was a force for change and/or continuity in his or her society:

- (a) Akhenaten **or** Horemheb
- (b) Alcibiades or Nicias
- (c) Agrippina the Younger **or** Nero.

or

Question 13 (25 marks)

Discuss the extent to which **one** of the following ideas contributed to cohesion and/or division in the period of study:

- (a) The development and features of the Cult of the Aten **or** The restoration of the god Amun Re
- (b) Oligarchy or Empire
- (c) Empire **or** The emergence of Christianity.

or

Question 14 (25 marks)

Discuss changing perspectives about **one** of the following events:

- (a) The death and funerary arrangements of Tutankhamun **or** Artistic representation in the Amarna period
- (b) The Sicilian Expedition or The causes of the Peloponnesian War post 440/39 BCE
- (c) The role of women in the Julio-Claudian dynasty **or** The artistic policies of Nero.

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
