





# CHILDREN, FAMILY AND THE COMMUNITY Stage 2 WACE Examination Design Brief - Written

Content: 40-60% from Unit 2A and 40-60% from Unit 2B

**Outcomes 1, 2, 3 and 4** 

Written exam paper sections	Supporting Information
Section one Multiple choice 15-20 questions	Selected response questions provide candidates with an opportunity to demonstrate knowledge and understanding without having to formulate a written answer.
20 minutes 20%	Questions relate to the unit content -specifically the practical application of key knowledge and understandings.
Section two Short response	Items may be generic or context specific.  These items allow students to respond to the fundamental,
10 questions	underpinning concepts of the course content e.g. interpersonal skills, leadership, conflict resolution and self management skills.
90 minutes	Formats may include short paragraphs, dot points,
50%	diagrams and tables.
	Items may relate to; analysis of data and diagrams, interpretation of media imagery and messages, stimulus material such as a photograph or a case study scenario and could be structured as a range of closed and open questions that increase in complexity. These will allow students to demonstrate their depth of knowledge.
Section three Extended response	Items to be generic and context specific.  Items allow students to respond to the fundamental
2-3 Questions	underpinning concepts of the course content eg interpersonal skills, leadership, conflict resolution and self management skills.
70 minutes	Formats may include extended essay responses that focus on the application of factual knowledge and
30%	understanding of the course and may be scaffolded to better examine depth of student understanding.

### **OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

The Children, Family and Community WACE written examination will have 3 sections. It will consist of one or more scenarios to provide a more holistic exam format rather than discrete independent questions.

Suitable stimulus materials could include diagrams, data analysis, case study scenarios, media interpretation and photographic stimulus.

A combined question/answer booklet will be used.

### **EXAMINATION LENGTH**

The format of the external examination is a 3 hour written paper with an additional 10 minutes reading time.

The general materials permitted for use in the WACE examination are: pens, pencils, eraser or correction fluid, ruler, highlighter, printed English language dictionary and/or bilingual dictionary (non electronic and not a thesaurus).

Sections	Supporting Information
Section one Multiple choice	Selected response questions provide candidates with an opportunity to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of course content. Several questions to feature 2 or more sections
10 questions	that interrogate depth of knowledge of a concept.
20 minutes	Stimulus material may be used and could include diagrams or photographic images for analysis.
20%	
Section two Short response	Items may include generic and context specific questions
5-6 questions	These items allow students to respond to the theoretical and conceptual knowledge of the course.
60 minutes	Formats may include short responses, dot points, diagrams and tables.
30%	Items may relate to; analysis of data and diagrams, interpretation of media imagery and messages, stimulus material such as a photograph or a case study scenario and could be structured as a range of closed and open questions that increase in complexity. These will allow students to demonstrate their depth of knowledge.
Section three Extended response	Items may be generic and context specific.
5 questions – choose 3	These items sample depth of course content and knowledge across the unit. The interrelationships between individuals, others and their world to include skills in managing complex

50%	Formats will include extended essay responses that focus on learnt skills in the prediction and evaluation of data.

### **OTHER CONSIDERATIONS**

The Children, Family and the Community WACE examination – written, will have 3 sections. It will consist of one or more scenarios to provide a more holistic exam format rather than discrete independent questions.

Suitable stimulus materials could include diagrams, newspaper/journal articles, case study scenarios and photographs
