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- (c) Outline **two (2)** production responsibilities that are undertaken when preparing for a dance performance. (2 marks)

- Comment on the ways in which the case study and viewed performance each reflect social attitudes to dance in Australia. (12 marks)
- Discuss the extent to which the case study and viewed performance support the above statement. (8 marks)

**Question 6****(30 marks)**

In what ways has the Dance course extended your knowledge of the following?

- Dance skills and technique e.g. anatomical and biomechanical facilitation. (6 marks)
- Choreographic processes, e.g. use of dance elements, choreographic structures and devices. (6 marks)
- The skills required to collaborate and communicate ideas. (6 marks)
- The study of dance as an art form (refer to at least **two** case studies and/or performances you have viewed). (8 marks)

**Question 7****(30 marks)**

‘Aboriginal dance in Australia today can reflect either or both contemporary and traditional influences.’

Discuss how these influences are represented through choreography, sound, lighting and costume by referring to a case study or viewed performance or ceremony.

- Provide a brief overview of the case study or viewed performance or ceremony. (6 marks)
- Discuss how Aboriginal culture is represented in the choreography, sound, lighting and costume. (12 marks)
- To what extent have contemporary and/or traditional dance influences impacted the dance work in the case study or viewed performance or ceremony? (8 marks)
