- (a) Explain how the relationship between the genders is explored through the choreography of *Shimmer*. (4 marks)

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- (b) Analyse how **two** motifs have been used to convey meaning in the dance work. (8 marks)

(a) Outline how the apple has been used in a specific section of *Shimmer*.

(3 marks)

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(b) Explain how the costumes contribute to the portrayal of **two** themes in the dance work.

(6 marks)

Youth dance provides social commentary on youth issues.

Discuss this statement with reference to **one** dance work from a case study.

- Provide an overview of the case study. (4 marks)
- Discuss the choreographic intent of the dance work. (5 marks)
- Analyse how the choreographer has manipulated **two** elements of dance and used choreographic structure and devices to communicate the choreographic intent. (11 marks)
- Outline how this work contributes to an understanding of a youth issue. (6 marks)
- Write your answer in a clear, well-organised manner, using dance terminology. (4 marks)

**Question 6****(30 marks)**

Dance companies often explore events and issues in society in order to create meaningful dance.

Discuss this statement with reference to **one** dance work from a significant dance company.

- Provide an overview of the dance company. (4 marks)
- Outline how the dance company has made a significant contribution to dance. (6 marks)
- Discuss the event **or** issue that is explored in the dance work. (6 marks)
- Analyse how the choreography and design concepts convey the meaning of the dance work. (10 marks)
- Write your answer in a clear, well-organised manner, using dance terminology. (4 marks)



## Question 7

(30 marks)

Choreographers use technologies to extend and enhance dance.

Discuss this statement with reference to a significant choreographer and **one** of their dance works.

- Provide an overview of the choreographer and their contribution to extending the boundaries of dance. (8 marks)
- Outline the choreographic intent of the dance work. (6 marks)
- Analyse how **two** technologies enhance the dance work. (12 marks)
- Write your answer in a clear, well-organised manner, using dance terminology. (4 marks)
