# GERMAN WACE Examination design brief: Stage 2

Oral examination: 30 minutes (25%)

Examination section	Supporting Information
Oral Preparation • Focus questions • 15 minutes	The oral component of this exam is divided into two parts.  During the preparation time, candidates are given a set of focus questions to prepare the conversation for Part A. This provides scaffolding for the Oral. Preparation time is provided to enable candidates the time to view the audiovisual stimulus. The number of times the stimulus is viewed is up to the candidates' discretion.  Schools will be advised of the unit focus for the stimulus by the end of term 2 e.g. 2AGER.

Part B: General conversation  Optional: own stimulus Spoken interaction Language: German 15 minutes 25%	In Part B, candidates must nominate and prepare a topic from the other learning contexts in e.g. 2BGER, to initiate a general conversation with the examiner. Candidates may bring a stimulus relevant to the focus of the prepared topic into the examination room.
	Candidates can only bring notes from the audio-visual stimulus into the examination interview room. They cannot bring notes for the prepared topic into the examination interview room. Bilingual, monolingual dictionaries and paper are provided and used during preparation time only. All notes should be left with the examiner after the examination.

Section One: Listening  • Focus questions  • 40 minutes	The written component of this exam is divided into three sections, with Sections Two and Three having two parts.
• 25%	Section One contains either a maximum of FIVE short audio texts or longer audio texts broken into segments. Candidates are required to respond to focus questions in German and/or English. The required language is specified in the examination.  Candidates hear each text twice.
Section Two: Viewing and reading Part A: Reading	Part A contains between 3-6 print stimulus texts. Varied, contemporary and unseen texts are used. Questions can be short answer, multiple choice, and/or True/False items.
3-6 print texts	Focus questions specify the language of response.
Part B: Vocabulary and structure • 25%	Part B focuses on e.g. the Form and Features of Language from Stage 2 (building on Stage 1). Questions can be multiple choice, sentence completion, cloze, and/or scrambled sentences.
Section Three: Writing	Each part of the writing section has a different unit focus.
Part A: Two stimuli  Choice of ONE question	Part A contains TWO stimulus options e.g. emails, letters, advertisements, photographs, graphs. Candidates choose ONE question for writing in German. Focus questions are in German and/or English.  Candidates are provided with a recommended word count of approximately 100 words.
Part B: Two focus questions	Part B contains TWO focus questions. Candidates choose ONE question for writing. Focus questions are in German and/or English. Candidates write in German.
	Candidates are provided with a recommended word count of approximately 100 words.

Oral Preparation	The oral component of this exam is divided into two parts.
15 minutes	In Part A, preparation time is provided to enable candidates the time to view the audio-visual stimulus. During this time, the candidates are given a set of focus

Section One: Listening  • Audio texts (5 max)	The written component of this exam is to be divided into three sections, with Sections Two and Three having two parts.
<ul><li>Focus questions</li><li>40 minutes</li><li>25%</li></ul>	Section one contains either a maximum of FIVE short audio texts or longer audio texts broken into segments. Candidates are required to respond to focus questions in German and/or English. The required language is specified in the examination.  Candidates hear the text twice.
Section Two: Viewing and reading Part A: Reading  • 3-6 print texts	Part A contains between 3-6 print stimulus texts. Varied, contemporary and unseen texts are used. Questions can be e.g. short answer, multiple choice, and/or True/False items.  Focus questions specify the language of response.
Part B: Vocabulary and structure • 25%	Part B Part B focuses on e.g. the Form and Features of Language from Stage 3 (building on Stage 2). Questions can be e.g. multiple choice, sentence completion, cloze, and/or scrambled sentences.
Section Three: Writing	Each part of the writing section has a different unit focus.
<ul><li>Part A: Two stimuli</li><li>Choice of topics</li><li>ONE question</li></ul>	Part A contains TWO stimulus options e.g. emails, letters, advertisements, photographs, graphs. Candidates choose ONE question for writing in German. Focus questions are in German and/or English. Candidates are provided with a recommended word count of approximately 150 words.
