Content: 40-60% from Unit 2A and 40-60% from Unit 2B

Assessment/item type	Supporting information
Section One Multiple-choice • 20 questions • 10% of the total mark • Suggested working time: 30 minutes	This section will contain questions that enable students to demonstrate knowledge of course content from Units 2A and 2B. Stimulus materials may be used which could include scenario descriptions, pictures, diagrams, maps, weather maps, articles and excerpts.
Section Two Short response • 10 questions • 45% of the total mark • Suggested working time: 60 minutes	A series of both closed and open items will be used. These will increase in complexity. Items will be scaffolded by having parts to the question allowing candidates to respond at increasing levels of difficulty. Items should enable candidates to respond in ways alternative to continuous prose, for example candidates may be asked to label diagrams, complete tables and construct flow charts. Stimulus materials will be used in this section. Suitable stimulus materials could include the use of scenarios or issues, photographs, diagrams, newspaper articles, topographical maps etc.
Section Three Extended response • 3 questions • 45% of the total mark • Suggested working time: 90 minutes	This section will encourage students to demonstrate their understandings through extended writing. Candidates will be required to draw on their experiences in the outdoors to assist them in addressing the items. Stimulus materials will be used in this section. Suitable stimulus materials could include the use of scenarios or issues, photographs, diagrams, newspaper articles etc.

Section One Multiple-choice • 20 questions • 10% of the total mark • Suggested working time: 30 minutes	This section will contain questions that enable students to demonstrate knowledge of course content from units 3A and 3B. Stimulus materials may include scenario description, pictures, diagrams, articles and excerpts.
Section Two Short response (closed and open response) • 10 questions • 45% of the total mark • Suggested working time: 60 minutes	A series of both closed and open items should be used that increase in complexity. Some will be scaffolded by having parts to the question to allow candidates to respond at increase levels of difficulty. Items should enable candidates to respond in ways alternative to continuous prose, for example students may be asked to label diagrams, complete tables, construct flow charts and complete triangulations etc. Stimulus materials will be used in this section. Suitable stimulus materials could include the use of scenarios or issues, photographs, diagrams, newspaper articles, topographical maps etc.
Section Three Extended response • 3 questions • 45% of the total mark • Suggested working time: 90 minutes	This section will encourage students to demonstrate their understandings through extended writing. Candidates will be required to draw on their experiences in the outdoors to assist them in addressing the items. Stimulus materials may be used in this section. Suitable stimulus materials could include the use of scenarios or issues, photographs, diagrams, newspaper articles etc.
