Suggested working time 60 minutes	Each question is worth 20 marks and is comprised of 4 parts. Each part has a different weighting and relates to the following formula: a. a term or phrase from a source. [2 marks] b. issues the sources raise. [4 marks] c. the relevant principles, structures, institutions, processes and practices associated with the issue raised by the sources. [6 marks] d. links to their political and legal knowledge. [8 marks]
Section Three: Essays (50 marks) Answer two questions from a choice of five. This section is worth 50% of the total exam Suggested working time 60 minutes	Choose any two from a choice of five. [25 marks each] Analytical/evaluative/comparative analysis style questioning possibly responding to propositions. Questions are derived from the specific content of the 3A and 3B units with the primary focus being the Australian political and legal system and where appropriate, reference to other systems.
