7	8	62


The mean number of hours of television watched was 11.57 hours.

Each participant would complete a divided attention task under two conditions: firstly in a room where the temperature was 16 °C; and secondly in a room where the temperature was 24 °C.

Room temperature	Mean divided attention score
16 °C	<u>49</u> 80
24 °C	<u>60</u> 80

In constructing your extended response, you should:

- define 'personality'
- describe each of the two (2) theories and name key theorists
- relate each theory to Kate's behaviour and characteristics
- outline the contributions and limitations of each personality theory.
