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**Question 1**

Using art terminology, describe Anish Kapoor’s application of elements and principles in the land art *Dismemberment, Site 1* (2009). In your answer, consider how the artwork interacts with the environment and/or space in which it is placed.

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## Question 2

(10 marks)

Refer to **Source 2** in the Source Booklet.

Bronek Kozka's digital image, *Kew house: dinner time* (2008) portrays the conventions of a contemporary family within a domestic setting.

Using art terminology, identify and describe how Kozka has used the elements and principles of art in **Source 2**.

For this question, your response may be in point form.

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**Section Two: Compare and contrast extended response**

**20% (30 Marks)**

This section contains **one (1)** question. You must answer this question. Write your answer in the spaces provided.

The artworks *The Raft* (2003) by Tony Flint (**Source 3**) and *Factory at Horta de Ebro* (1909) by Pablo Picasso (**Source 4**) are examples of the artists' interpretation of industrial environments.

Compare and contrast the two artworks.

Analyse the artworks and in your response consider:

- the differences and the similarities between the two artworks
- the style, composition, technique and subject matter
- what meaning the artists are communicating through their artwork
- your personal response, with reference to the artworks.

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**Section Three: Extended response****20% (50 Marks)**

This section contains **two (2)** questions. You must answer **one (1)** question. Write your answer on the lined pages following Question 5.

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**Question 4****(50 marks)**

How does the artist(s) you have studied this year communicate their social, cultural, historical and/or political concerns in their artwork?
